Additional Notes:

Legume: Members of this family (the pea family) of plants make associations with soil bacteria that fix nitrogen from the air into the soil, enriching the soil for future/nearby plants. These plants are also high in proteins, and we are experimenting with establishing native perennials around the farm for the sheep to graze.

Seed sources: We strive to use seeds of local plants. Most seeds were originally obtained from <u>Roundstone</u> <u>Native Seed Company.</u> Some were wild collected from our farm or neighbors' farms. A couple species' seeds were obtained from <u>Prairie Moon Nursery</u>. Most Forbs in our nursery were chosen by regional NRCS/ <u>Pheasants Forever</u> experts for a wildlife and monarch butterfly planting we seeded in 2023 using <u>NRCS EQIP</u>.
